TOPIC: WHY MILITARY PSYCHIATRY IS DIFFERENT



This talk will examine the cultural and clinical practice challenges of military psychiatry. It will discuss the ethical and occupational aspects of working with the military. The working milieu, relevant military regulations, safety standards, patient risk factors and the more common clinical presentations are discussed.

Learning Outcomes:

It is hoped that the talk can increase the understanding of the uniqueness for psychiatry of working within a military structure. The talk aims to convey the risk related issues of mental illness in military personnel.

SPEAKER: DR JOHN TOBIN was the consultant psychiatrist to the Irish Defence Forces between 1997 and 2018. He also served as Irish PpP representative to the Military Mental Expert Panel of NATO for seven years. He has served overseas with Irish Peacekeeping Forces in the Lebanon, East Timor and Liberia. He initially trained and practiced in general and forensic psychiatry in Ireland, Canada and the UK. He is currently a trainer with the Institute for International Criminal Investigations. He has worked in the area of sexual and gender -based violence in different zones of conflict for the UN.

TOPIC: RESEARCH AND AUDIT IN CLINICAL PRACTICE

This talk looks at the requirements and regulations governing clinical audit and research, and has practical advice about implementing these in practice for psychiatrists and trainees in psychiatry.

- To understand the relevance of GDPR in this area;
- To have an awareness of the Health Research Regulations 2018; and
- To have some ideas about how to put these into practice.



SPEAKER: PROF BRENDAN KELLY FRCPSYCH FRCPI is Professor of Psychiatry at Trinity College Dublin and Consultant Psychiatrist at Tallaght University Hospital. Professor Kelly has authored and co-authored over 200 peer-reviewed papers and 300 non-peer-reviewed papers, as well as a number of book chapters and books. His most recent books are *Mental Health in Ireland: The Complete Guide for Patients, Families and Healthcare Professionals* (Liffey Press) and *The Doctor Who Sat For A Year* (Gill, 2019).
